Sending Church: New Life Baptist Church, Chiang Mai, Thailand

Dear Friends,

We want to say a huge 'thank you' to all of you who have been faithfully supporting our ministry and for enabling us to do what we do. We are so grateful and we consider it a privilege to be in partnership with you for the cause of the Gospel.

I have been on the mission field here in England for one year now. It was a blessing to have a small church to work with from the outset and I am delighted to report that we have had some consistent visitors attending our services in recent weeks. One gentleman, Alan, has been coming as a result of our posting New Testaments through the letter-boxes of local houses. Another gentleman, George and his wife Mo (a Thai lady) and their twin daughters have also been coming. Linda met this family through teaching the Thai language at the church building. Please pray for them, especially for Mo who is a Buddhist. But what an encouragement it has been having a Sunday School class for children at the church! These recent visitors are a direct answer to my personal prayers and the prayers of others concerned with this work.

We have put out at least 3,000 King James New Testaments through the letter boxes. We still have another 2,000 to go and I am looking forward to more responses. People have generally been positive to receiving this gift from our church and it has really put us on the map locally. People now know who we are and where we are!

We will be hosting another Games & Gospel Night very soon for some of the younger people who live locally. This ministry worked really well the first time and I have been very keen to repeat it (but needed to postpone until I passed my UK driving test as the car is essential transporting the things we need to the church building). Please pray for the young people that hear the Gospel that they have receptive hearts and minds.

The family are well. However, we do have prayer requests. Mai's medical condition is an ongoing issue. He was initially prescribed the wrong dosage of medicine for his Raynaud's disease and then put on prescribed medicine that distracted him from his studies. He has since stopped taking the medicine and is waiting to see a specialist. Also, we have come up against some resistance to the fact that we homeschool our children. I don't consider this to be a major problem (and actually a good witnessing opportunity) but pray it doesn't discourage the family in anyway.
