### New House for a Missionary Family

I'd like to take a moment to introduce you to the Miller Family. I've known Billy for several years now; and, Dani grew up as one of the younger kids in our church. Her grandfather (Dr. Don Mangus) was my pastor as I grew up.

Billy has been working with a major internet company for the last several years; and their family has grown a very successful sheep farm in the hills of Tennessee.

Two years ago, we visited with them in their newly finished home; and they began to share with us their burden for no longer pursuing the American Dream and instead following the Great Commission. I've heard that story many times over the years. Rare is the occasion when it eventuates.

Last year at Christmas, Billy called and we talked about missions. He said at that time that they just could not get it off their minds. It was obvious to me that God was drawing them to the foreign field.

When I was in the States in July, I got the most unusual phone call from Billy--they had just sold the farm and were ready to move to Papua New Guinea. Could we get things ready for them to come at the New Year?

It was a step of faith for them. It has been a step of faith for us.

The Millers are coming to join in the ministry here in Port Moresby. They are coming without doing deputation; and they are planning to be here for at least two years. During that two year period, they want to serve God without attachment to the financial entrapments that are so common to current global thinking.

We have had two donors come forward with an offer to match up to \$40,000 by the end of November. We have seen \$28,000 come in in the last six weeks. That is so exciting! This leaves us with only one more week to make full use of that match.

The Millers have purchased airline tickets for January 5th to leave the USA. Upon arrival in PNG, they will need to do a 14-day quarantine. The options are to have them stay at the Holiday Inn (that is where Becky and I stayed), or they could move right into this house if it is ready. We will scrounge around and get them beds and a fridge. But we need to get a roof on this house first.
