Our last international trip is currently underway as I type this letter, with over 30 team members serving with Calvary Baptist Church in Chipata, Zambia. Veteran missionary Todd Beaman is hosting our team in a remote village. Even now, souls are being saved as the Gospel goes forth!

We are praising the Lord for safe, successful surgical trips to our surgical center in El Progreso, Honduras. Dr. Jason Frazer, our surgical director, organized teams in July and October with both general and orthopedic surgeries. What an amazing gift to be able to assist in this capacity. Dozens of Hondurans received life-changing surgeries and every single one of them heard the plan of salvation. The church members of Beacon Baptist Church in El Progreso handled all of the patient registration, clean up, phone calls, and cooking. We believe in the local church and our operation of the surgical center reflects that philosophy! Watching the church people and the teamwork side by side to spread the gospel is another gift we do not take for granted. We even had the privilege to operate on a missionary wife who was in need- imagine getting such great care on the mission field!

The end of July found us in the Galapagos Islands, Ecuador assisting a small church plant on the island of Santa Cruz. Galapagos is truly a beautiful place. Our medical, dental, and optical clinics were packed every day and every night we had to turn away hundreds of needy patients. We were shocked by how few resources are available on such a beautiful island. By the end of the week, we had seen over 200 patients accept Christ with over 1,500 patients treated. Praise the Lord for His goodness.

In August we had two teams go out simultaneously to work with Pastor Jerry Wyatt in Morogoro, Tanzania and Pastor Brett George in Sighet Marmatiei, Romania. Although these countries have very different cultures, we are so thankful that they have the same God! Praise the Lord for over 300 professions of faith in Tanzania, and for dozens of people interested in learning more about Jesus in Romania. Medicine opens doors even in the most difficult places.

Our family and team members are all settled in Atlanta and we are enjoying the area. We are thankful for Pinecrest Baptist Church and our children have jumped right in with youth group and singing in the church choir. Please pray for Medical Missions Outreach as we plan on purchasing an office space and warehouse in the near future. We are excited about our new location and the ease with which we can make all of our international flights!

We would be remiss if we did not thank you, our supporters, for praying, giving, and joining us on teams. We are continually awed by what the Lord allows us to do with Medical Missions Outreach and we are humbled that you would support us in this endeavor. We are excited about finishing the year strong and starting off the new travel season the first week of January!
